


It is a revision of the 1982 original edition of Cultural Kaleidoscope prepared by the Lira Singers and WCEV Radio and edited by Lucyna Migala for the Illinois Arts Council. MFDC is one of the original Listed artists.

It later became the Ethnic and Folk Performing Artists Directory then the Arts Tour Artist Roster. Presently the printed directory Has been replaced by an on-line version

This is an excerpt of the preface.

The *Illinois Ethnic Performing Arts Directory* is the revised and expanded edition of *Cultural Kaleidoscope 1982*, which was originally prepared by the Lira Singers and WCEV Radio/1450 AM and edited by Lucyna Migala for the Illinois Arts Council.

In late 1983, Cheryl Yuen, Director of Community Development, perceived the necessity of a revised and updated *Illinois Ethnic Performing Arts Directory*. Ruby Cheung, a graduate student in the Community Arts Management Program at Sangamon State University, Springfield, Ill., was retained as Project Coordinator/Editor of the *Directory* under the supervision of Egle Victoria Zygas, Director of Folk and Ethnic Arts Programs, through Jonathan Katz, Community Arts Management Program Director at Sangamon State University.

The purpose of the *Illinois Ethnic Performing Arts Directory* is to promote ethnic performers and groups, to bring them together with presenters of performances, and thereby to provide more people in Illinois the opportunity to share in the rich heritage of ethnic arts.

Sources of ethnic performers for the *Directory* were based on the first edition and the lists of ethnic artists provided by various consulates, state agencies, non-profit organizations, and several individuals. Artists and groups listed in the *Directory* are residents of Illinois, with at least one year of performance history, who present through performances a particular cultural heritage. This *Directory* is distributed nationwide, and requires no financial obligation from the listed performers.

Basically, the Illinois Ethnic Performing Arts Directory is divided into three sections.

1. Refer to Section I, where performers and groups are listed according to their art forms and their ethnic heritage. Groups

Stomping Grounds unites Chicagoans with rhythm

Friday marked the conclusion of Chicago Human Rhythm Project's two-month-long rhythmic dance festival called Stomping Grounds. A celebratory performance at the newly renovated Studebaker Theater inside the Fine Arts Building presented a fun history lesson on cultural dance forms grounded in rhythm: American tap, African dance, Mexican dance, Irish step dancing and two forms from Spain (Ballet Espanol and flamenco).

Dancers making music with their feet is an easy crowdpleaser, and a testimony to CHRP artistic director Lane Alexander's mantra that rhythm brings people together.

Putting culturally specific forms together on the same stage points to the many different ways dancers can celebrate rhythm and the idiosyncrasies of expressing culture with one's feet. As with culinary arts or music, there are distinctions between dance forms, seen through variations in steps and sounds, but also in the dancers' shoes, clothing and body positions (for example, the stiffarmed military stance of Irish dance versus the flirtatious, sway-backed poses of Spanish dancers or the joyful articulation of the torso in West African aesthetics).


Copious program notes and talking points supported the audience's observations and gave a little insight into what was being seen in this free two-hour performance.

That part of Stomping Grounds has been the same since this young festival kicked off three years ago, and the grand finale Friday was the same as it ever was.
